Mr. ALTMIRE (for himself, Mr. PLATTS, and Mr. RYAN of Ohio) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To assist volunteer fire companies in coping with the precipitous rise in fuel prices.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supporting America’s
5 Volunteer Emergency Services Act of 2008”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

8 (1) According to the Federal Emergency Man-
9 agement Agency, in 2006 there were—

1 (A) 807,150 volunteer firefighters, nearly
2 73 percent of all active firefighters; and

3 (B) 19,915 all-volunteer fire companies na-
4 tionwide, servicing 22.6 percent of the popu-
5 lation of the United States and 4,105 compa-
6 nies comprised of a majority of volunteers, serv-
7 icing 16.3 percent of the population of the
8 United States.

9 (2) These volunteer companies, especially those
10 serving communities of fewer than 5,000 residents,
11 rely heavily upon fund-raising efforts and other po-
12 tentially unreliable sources of funding for their basic
13 operating expenses.

14 (3) According to the Energy Information Ad-
15 ministration, between June 2003 and June 2008,
16 the price of regular grade gasoline and diesel fuels
17 rose 171 percent and 229 percent, respectively.

18 (4) These rising costs represent an unavoidable
19 burden, and have placed serious constraints on the
20 ability of volunteer companies to respond to fire
21 emergencies.

1 **SEC. 3. DEFINITION OF QUALIFIED VOLUNTEER FIRE DE-**
2 **PARTMENT.**

3 In this Act, the term “qualified volunteer fire depart-
4 ment” has the same meaning given that term in section
5 150(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

6 **SEC. 4. GASOLINE AND DIESEL FUEL SUBSIDY PROGRAM.**

7 (a) ESTABLISHMENT OF BASELINE.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Federal Emergency
9 Management Agency shall, for calendar year 2007,
10 determine for each of the 5 Petroleum Administra-
11 tion for Defense Districts the average annual price
12 per gallon for—

13 (A) gasoline; and

14 (B) diesel fuel.

15 (2) BASIS FOR PRICE PER GALLON.—The aver-
16 age annual price per gallon determined under para-
17 graph (1) shall be based solely on data reported by
18 the Energy Information Administration.

19 (3) BASELINE.—The price per gallon deter-
20 mined under paragraph (1) shall serve as the base-
21 line fuel cost for each Petroleum Administration for
22 Defense District.

23 (b) PAYMENTS.—

24 (1) SUBMISSION OF RECEIPTS.—At the end of
25 each calendar year, each qualified volunteer fire de-
26 partment seeking reimbursement under this section

1 shall submit to the Federal Emergency Management
2 Agency all of its receipts and bills of sales docu-
3 menting the amounts of gasoline and diesel fuel pur-
4 chased by such department during that calendar
5 year. Each department shall also provide a sum total
6 of the—

7 (A) aggregate number of gallons of gaso-
8 line and diesel fuel purchased by the depart-
9 ment during that calendar year; and

10 (B) costs of purchasing such gasoline and
11 diesel fuel.

12 (2) DETERMINATION OF SUBSIDY AMOUNTS.—

13 The Federal Emergency Management Agency shall
14 reimburse a qualified volunteer fire department for
15 75 percent of the difference between—

16 (A) the actual expenditures of the depart-
17 ment for gasoline and diesel fuel for a calendar
18 year as determined under paragraph (1); and

19 (B) the amount that such expenditures
20 would have cost had the department determined
21 such expenditures utilizing the baseline fuels
22 costs determined under subsection (a).

23 (3) SPECIAL RULE RELATING TO STATES SALES

24 TAX.—If the State in which a qualified volunteer fire
25 department is located does not charge local or State

1 fuel taxes on such departments when such depart-
2 ments purchase gasoline or diesel fuel, the amount
3 of such omitted sales tax shall be added back in to
4 any determination made under paragraph (2)(A).

5 (c) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 60 days after the
6 date of enactment of this Act, the Federal Emergency
7 Management Agency shall promulgate such regulations as
8 may be necessary to implement and administer the grant
9 and subsidy programs authorized by this section.

10 **SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

11 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
12 as are necessary to carry out this Act.

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
