RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the Senate should ratify the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW).

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-

2 is vital to the development and well-being of people
3 of all nations; and

4 (2) the Senate should, therefore, give its advice
5 and consent to the ratification of the Convention on
