Ms. CASTOR, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1538) to amend title 10, United States Code, to improve the management of medical care, personnel actions, and quality of life issues for members of the Armed Forces who are receiving medical care in an outpatient status, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of

1 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 1538) to amend title 10, United
4 States Code, to improve the management of medical care,
5 personnel actions, and quality of life issues for members
6 of the Armed Forces who are receiving medical care in
7 an outpatient status, and for other purposes. The first
8 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of
9 order against consideration of the bill are waived except
10 those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. General
11 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
12 one hour and 20 minutes, with one hour equally divided
13 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
14 member of the Committee on Armed Services and 20 min-
15 utes equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
16 ranking minority member of the Committee on Veterans'
17 Affairs. After general debate the bill shall be considered
18 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in
19 order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of
20 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in
21 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
22 on Armed Services now printed in the bill. The committee
23 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-
24 ered as read. All points of order against the committee
25 amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived except

1 those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. Notwith-
2 standing clause 11 of rule XVIII, no amendment to the
3 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall
4 be in order except those printed in the report of the Com-
5 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such
6 amendment may be offered only in the order printed in
7 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated
8 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-
9 able for the time specified in the report equally divided
10 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall
11 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
12 a demand for division of the question in the House or in
13 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against
14 such amendments are waived except those arising under
15 clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. At the conclusion of consider-
16 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
17 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
18 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
19 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
20 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the com-
21 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The pre-
22 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
23 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-
24 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or
25 without instructions.

1 SEC. 2. During consideration in the House of H.R.
2 1538 pursuant to this resolution, notwithstanding the op-
3 eration of the previous question, the Chair may postpone
4 further consideration of the bill to a time designated by
5 the Speaker.
