## A BILL

To amend chapter 35 of title 28, United States Code, to preserve the independence of United States attorneys.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Preserving United  
5 States Attorney Independence Act of 2007”.

1 **SEC. 2. VACANCIES.**

2 Section 546 of title 28, United States Code, is  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 **“§ 546. Vacancies**

5 “The United States district court for a district in  
6 which the office of the United States attorney is vacant  
7 may appoint a United States attorney to serve until that  
8 vacancy is filled. The order of appointment by the court  
9 shall be filed with the clerk of the court.”.

10 *Section 546 of title 28, United States Code, is amended*  
11 *by striking subsection (c) and inserting the following:*

12 “(c) A person appointed as United States attorney  
13 under this section may serve until the earlier of—

14 “(1) the qualification of a United States attor-  
15 ney for such district appointed by the President  
16 under section 541 of this title; or

17 “(2) the expiration of 120 days after appoint-  
18 ment by the Attorney General under this section.

19 “(d) If an appointment expires under subsection  
20 (c)(2), the district court for such district may appoint a  
21 United States attorney to serve until the vacancy is filled.  
22 The order of appointment by the court shall be filed with  
23 the clerk of the court.”.

24 **SEC. 3. APPLICABILITY.**

25 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The amendments made by this Act*  
26 *shall take effect on the date of enactment of this Act.*

1       **(b) APPLICATION.**—

2           **(1) IN GENERAL.**—*Any person serving as a*  
3       *United States attorney on the day before the date of*  
4       *enactment of this Act who was appointed under sec-*  
5       *tion 546 of title 28, United States Code, may serve*  
6       *until the earlier of—*

7           **(A)** *the qualification of a United States at-*  
8       *torney for such district appointed by the Presi-*  
9       *dent under section 541 of that title; or*

10          **(B)** *120 days after the date of enactment of*  
11       *this Act.*

12          **(2) EXPIRED APPOINTMENTS.**—*If an appoint-*  
13       *ment expires under paragraph (1), the district court*  
14       *for that district may appoint a United States attor-*  
15       *ney for that district under section 546(d) of title 28,*  
16       *United States Code, as added by this Act.*
