Mr. CASEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry

A BILL

To require semiannual indexing of mandatory Federal food assistance programs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Hunger Re-
5 lief Act of 2008”.

6 **SEC. 2. NUTRITION PROGRAMS.**

7 (a) SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PRO-
8 GRAM.—Section 3(u) of the Food and Nutrition Act of
9 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2012(u)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “(u) ‘Thrifty food plan’ means”
2 and inserting the following:

3 “(u) THRIFTY FOOD PLAN.—

4 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The term ‘thrifty food
5 plan’ means”;

6 (2) in the second sentence—

7 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (1)
8 through (4) as subparagraphs (A) through (D),
9 respectively, and indenting appropriately;

10 (B) by striking “The cost of such diet”
11 and inserting the following:

12 “(2) ADJUSTMENTS.—The cost of the diet de-
13 scribed in paragraph (1)”;

14 (C) by striking subparagraph (D) (as re-
15 designated by subparagraph (A)) and inserting
16 the following:

17 “(D)(i) on October 1, 2009, adjust the
18 cost of the diet to reflect 102 percent of the
19 cost of the diet in the preceding June, and
20 round the result to the nearest higher dollar in-
21 crement for each household size, except that the
22 Secretary may not reduce the cost of the diet
23 below that in effect during the immediately pre-
24 ceding fiscal year;

1 “(ii) on October 1, 2010, adjust the cost of
2 the diet to reflect 102.5 percent of the cost of
3 the diet in the preceding June, and round the
4 result to the nearest higher dollar increment for
5 each household size, except that the Secretary
6 may not reduce the cost of the diet below that
7 in effect during the immediately preceding fiscal
8 year; and

9 “(iii) on October 1, 2011, and each Octo-
10 ber 1 thereafter, adjust the cost of the diet to
11 reflect 103 percent of the cost of the diet in the
12 preceding June, and round the result to the
13 nearest higher dollar increment for each house-
14 hold size, except that the Secretary may not re-
15 duce the cost of the diet below that in effect
16 during the immediately preceding fiscal year.”.

17 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

18 (1) Section 19(a)(2)(A)(ii) of the Food and Nu-
19 trition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2028(a)(2)(A)(ii)) is
20 amended by striking “3(u)(4)” and inserting
21 “3(u)(2)”.

22 (2) Section 27(a)(2)(C) of the Food and Nutri-
23 tion Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2036(a)(2)(C)) is
24 amended by striking “3(u)(4)” and inserting
25 “3(u)(2)”.

1 **SEC. 3. SCHOOL MEALS.**

2 (a) **COMMODITIES.**—Section 6(c)(1) of the Richard
3 B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C.
4 1755(c)(1)) is amended—

5 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking “on July
6 1, 1982, and each July 1 thereafter” and inserting
7 “in accordance with subparagraph (B)”;

8 (2) by striking subparagraph (B) and inserting
9 the following:

10 “(B) **ADJUSTMENT.**—The Secretary shall—

11 “(i) on each January 1, increase the value of
12 food assistance for each meal by the annual percent-
13 age change in a 3-month average value of the Price
14 Index for Foods Used in Schools and Institutions for
15 September, October, and November each year;

16 “(ii) on each July 1, increase the value of food
17 assistance for each meal by the annual percentage
18 change in a 3-month average value of the Price
19 Index for Foods Used in Schools and Institutions for
20 March, April, and May each year; and

21 “(iii) round the result of each increase to the
22 nearest higher $\frac{1}{4}$ cent.”.

23 (b) **OVERALL ADJUSTMENT.**—Section 11(a) of the
24 Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C.
25 1759a(a)) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (2), by striking “98.75 cents”
2 and inserting “the amount computed under para-
3 graph (3)”; and

4 (2) in paragraph (3)—

5 (A) in subparagraph (A)—

6 (i) in the matter before clause (i), by
7 striking “July 1, 1982, and on each subse-
8 quent July 1, an annual adjustment” and
9 inserting “each January 1 and July 1, a
10 semiannual increase”; and

11 (ii) in clause (ii), by striking “(as es-
12 tablished under paragraph (2) of this sub-
13 section)”; and

14 (B) in subparagraph (B)—

15 (i) in clause (i), by striking “annual
16 adjustment” and inserting “semiannual in-
17 crease”;

18 (ii) in clause (ii)—

19 (I) by striking “annual adjust-
20 ment” and inserting “semiannual in-
21 crease”; and

22 (II) by striking “12-month pe-
23 riod” and inserting “6-month period”;
24 and

1 (iii) by striking clause (iii) and insert-
2 ing the following:

3 “(iii) ROUNDING.—On each January
4 1 and July 1, the national average pay-
5 ment rates for meals and supplements
6 shall be—

7 “(I) increased to the nearest
8 higher cent; and

9 “(II) based on the unrounded
10 amount previously in effect.”.

11 (c) PAYMENTS TO SERVICE INSTITUTIONS.—Section
12 13(b)(1) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch
13 Act (42 U.S.C. 1761(b)(1)) is amended by striking sub-
14 paragraph (B) and inserting the following:

15 “(B) ADJUSTMENTS.—The Secretary
16 shall—

17 “(i) on each January 1, increase each
18 amount specified in subparagraph (A) as
19 adjusted through the preceding July 1 to
20 reflect changes for the 6-month period end-
21 ing the preceding November 30 in the se-
22 ries for food away from home of the Con-
23 sumer Price Index for All Urban Con-
24 sumers published by the Bureau of Labor
25 Statistics of the Department of Labor;

1 “(ii) on each July 1, increase each
2 amount specified in subparagraph (A) as
3 adjusted through the preceding January 1
4 to reflect changes for the 6-month period
5 ending the preceding May 31 in the series
6 for food away from home of the Consumer
7 Price Index for All Urban Consumers pub-
8 lished by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of
9 the Department of Labor;

10 “(iii) base each increase on the
11 unrounded amount previously in effect;
12 and

13 “(iv) round each increase described in
14 clauses (i) and (ii) to the nearest higher
15 cent increment.”.

16 (d) REIMBURSEMENT OF FAMILY OR GROUP DAY
17 CARE HOME SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS.—

18 (1) TIER I.—Section 17(f)(3)(A)(ii)(IV) of the
19 Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42
20 U.S.C. 1766(f)(3)(A)(ii)(IV)) is amended by striking
21 subclause (IV) and inserting the following:

22 “(IV) ADJUSTMENTS.—On each
23 July 1 and January 1, the Secretary
24 shall—

1 “(aa) increase each reim-
2 bursement factor under this sub-
3 paragraph to reflect the changes
4 in the Consumer Price Index for
5 food at home for the most recent
6 6-month period for which the
7 data are available;

8 “(bb) base each increase on
9 the unrounded amount previously
10 in effect; and

11 “(cc) round each increase
12 described in item (aa) to the
13 nearest higher cent increment.”.

14 (2) TIER II.—Section 17(f)(3)(A)(iii)(I) of the
15 Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42
16 U.S.C. 1766(f)(3)(A)(iii)(I)) is amended by striking
17 item (bb) and inserting the following:

18 “(bb) ADJUSTMENTS.—On
19 each July 1 and January 1, the
20 Secretary shall increase the reim-
21 bursement factors to reflect the
22 changes in the Consumer Price
23 Index for food at home for the
24 most recent 6-month period for
25 which the data are available, base

1 the increases on the unrounded
2 amount previously in effect, and
3 round the increases to the near-
4 est higher cent increment.”.

5 (e) SPECIAL MILK PROGRAM.—Section 3(a) of the
6 Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1772(a)) is
7 amended—

8 (1) by striking paragraph (7) and inserting the
9 following:

10 “(7) MINIMUM RATE OF REIMBURSEMENT.—
11 For each school year, the minimum rate of reim-
12 bursement for a ½ pint of milk served in schools
13 and other eligible institutions shall be not less than
14 minimum rate of reimbursement in effect on Sep-
15 tember 30, 2008, as increased on a semiannual basis
16 each school year to reflect changes in the Producer
17 Price Index for Fresh Processed Milk published by
18 the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the Department of
19 Labor.”; and

20 (2) in paragraph (8), by inserting “higher”
21 after “nearest”.

22 **SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

23 The amendments made by this Act take effect on Oc-
24 tober 1, 2008.

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
