

PROVIDING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 2076, MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, JUSTICE, AND STATE, THE JUDICIARY, AND RELATED AGENCIES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1996, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 198]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 198, by a voice vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of H.R. 2076, the “Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations Bill for the fiscal year 1996” under an open rule. The rule provides one hour of general debate divided equally between the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations.

The rule waives clause 2 (prohibiting unauthorized and legislative provisions) and clause 6 (prohibiting reappropriations) of rule XXI against provisions in the bill.

The rule provides for the reading of the bill by title, rather than by paragraph or numbered section, for amendment, and each title is considered as read. Members who have preprinted their amendments in the Record prior to their consideration will be given priority in recognition to offer their amendments if otherwise consistent with the House rules.

Finally, the rule provides for one motion to recommit, with or without instructions.
