REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 270]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 270, by a record vote of 6 to 4, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of House Joint Resolution 122, making further continuing appropriations for fiscal year 1996, in the House without intervening point of order. The rule orders the previous question to final passage without intervening motion except that: (1) the joint resolution shall be debatable for one hour, equally divided and controlled by the chairman and the ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations; and (2) there may be one motion to recommit which, if containing instructions, may only be offered by the Minority Leader or his designee.
