REPORT

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 176, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of an unnumbered concurrent resolution of either House providing for the adjournment of the two Houses during the Independence Day district work period. The rule waives all points of order against the consideration of the resolution.

While adjournment resolutions are ordinarily privileged, a point of order could be raised against the July 4th district work period resolution on grounds it violates section 309 of the Budget Act that requires that the House cannot adjourn for more than three calendar days in July if it has not completed action on all appropriations bills; and on the grounds that it violates section 310 of the Budget Act that requires the same with respect to completing action on a reconciliation bill if one is required by the budget resolution.
