REPORT

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 253, by a record vote of 6 to 3, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The Resolution provides for the consideration of H. Res. 244, "Subpoena Enforcement in the Case of Dornan v. Sanchez" under a closed rule. The rule provides one hour of debate divided equally between the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on House Oversight. The rule waives points of order against consideration of the resolution. Finally, the rule provides for one motion to recommit which may not contain instructions and on which the previous question shall be considered as ordered.
