REPORT

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 262, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of H.R. 1122, the “Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 1997” with Senate amendments, under a rule providing for a motion to concur in the Senate amendments in the House. The rule provides one hour of debate divided equally between the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary.

Summary of Motion: To make in order the Hoyer amendment in the nature of a substitute which would ban all post-viability abortions except where continuation of the pregnancy would endanger the life of the woman or risk grievous injury to her health, and sets

forth civil penalties for the violation by a physician of this prohibition.

Summary of Motion: To make in order the Lowey amendment which provides that the restriction on abortion procedures in this bill would apply only post-viability and would include an exception in order to avert serious adverse health consequences to the mother.
