REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 311]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 311, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of certain resolutions in preparation for the adjournment of the first session sine die. The rule provides for consideration of a joint resolution waiving certain enrollment requirements with respect to certain specified bills, which shall be considered as read. The rule also provides for one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader, and one motion to commit.

Section 2 of the resolution provides for consideration of a joint resolution appointing the day for the convening of the second session of the 105<sup>th</sup> Congress, which shall be considered as read. The rule also provides for one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader, and one motion to commit.

Section 3 of the resolution provides that the Speaker, the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader may accept resignations and make appointments to commissions, boards, and committees following the adjournment of the first session sine die.

Section 4 of the rule provides that a resolution providing that a committee of two Members of the House be appointed to inform the President that the House is ready to adjourn unless the President

has some other communication to make to them, is considered as adopted.

Section 5 of the rule provides that a concurrent resolution providing that the two Houses of Congress assemble in the Hall of the House on Tuesday, January 27, 1998, at 9 p.m. to receive any communication from the President is considered as adopted.

Finally, section 6 provides that House Resolution 306, Waiving a Requirement of Clause 4(b) of rule XI with Respect to Consideration of Certain Resolutions Reported from the Committee on Rules, is laid on the table.
